Track 1: Join us for *Bias Match, a workshop where you will uncover unconscious biases* using games, facilitated by Science Melting Pot. The primary goal of the workshop is to raise awareness of unconscious biases and their impact on decision-making in the workplace. Through games you'll match different types of biases with their definitions, uncovering how they influence our decisions and behaviors—often without us even realizing it. You'll also have the opportunity to reflect on real-life examples, exploring how biases can lead to flawed decisions and unequal opportunities. By the end of the workshop, you'll walk away with practical strategies to address biases and foster a more inclusive, equitable work environment.

Track 2: ChatGPT at Work by Professor Jacob Sherson: New habits, new opportunities GenAl is not just the future – it is already an effective tool in your everyday life. With a hybrid intelligence mindset and simple tools like Custom GPTs, everyone – even those without coding skills – can work smarter in research, teaching, and administration. Get concrete examples, inspiration, and a framework for using GenAl systematically instead of randomly.
